

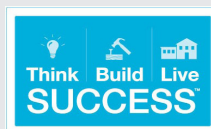

Cherry Hill Farmhouse, with its adjoining barn and park, is a historic family farm managed by the Falls Church City Recreation & Parks Department. It is an 1845 homestead that depicts rural life in mid-19th century Virginia. Cherry Hill was once a 73-acre farm run by the Blaisdell family. We interpret their time on the farm with special emphasis on the difficulties they faced during the Civil War. Volunteer Opportunities: help conduct historic tours of the barn and farmhouse. A training session and manual will be provided for the house. In the barn volunteers will assist children as they grind and shell corn. Volunteers are needed to do research involving slave census records and other Civil War related topics. These projects are ideal for volunteers who love history and can be tailored to interest in the Civil War.
